

## ESPS Anti-Bullying



The Northern Ireland Anti-Bullying Forum (NIABF) defines bullying as the repeated use of power by one or more persons intentionally to harm, hurt or adversely affect the rights and needs of another or others.

Bullying is unacceptable behaviour in Euston Street. We work hard to prevent and discourage inappropriate behaviours including bullying. We will react and deal with incidents of bullying behaviour quickly, fairly and consistently. We will inform parents of incidents of bullying and we would expect their full support.



Cyberbullying can be defined as, 'the use of ICT, particularly mobile phones and the internet to deliberately hurt or upset someone'.

In ESPS we do not tolerate this behaviour and any incidents occurring in school will be dealt with through our Citizenship and Behaviour and Anti-bullying policies.

Whilst school cannot be held responsible for matters of cyberbullying that originate outside school times and environment, we will address all matters relating to pastoral care, safeguarding and learning.

- Do be honest

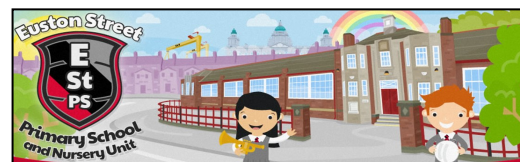
