Homework

Pupils will have reading homework Monday to Thursday evenings each week.

They will have one page of spellings to practise each week which will either focus on a specific sound or high frequency words.

They will be learning their tricky words continuously as required.

There is literacy written homework on Monday night and numeracy on a Tuesday night.

Mental maths homework is on-going. We will focus on a different skill each week.

<u>ICT</u>

Your child will have access to iPads, cameras, computers and interactive whiteboards to support their learning throughout the year.

Topic work in Year 3

In school we study the World Around Us (WAU) in each year group. Pupils in Year 3 will develop their WAU scientific, geographical and historical knowledge in 5 topics areas during the year, namely: People Who Help Us, Senses, Materials, Journeys and Transport. Please read and discuss aspects of these topic areas at every opportunity at home.

Pupils will also work on their <u>Thinking Skills and</u> <u>Personal Capabilities (TSPC)</u> throughout their topic work including: Working with Others, Being Creative, Managing Information, Problem Solving/Decision making and Self-Management. Again please encourage opportunities for your child to develop these skills at home as well. Ask your teacher for ideas if needed.

Numeracy

As you will hear, your child will have a lot of knowledge and skills to work through in Year 3. They will need your on-going support. The areas of Numeracy in Year 3 are:

Number

Counting forward to 100 and backwards from 100 Counting in 2s, 5s and 10s within 100 Number before, after, between within 100

Addition facts/ Subtraction facts

Ordering consecutive/non-consecutive

Data Handling

Using tree, Carroll and Venn diagrams for sorting (Google them if unsure!)

Block graphs and pictographs for representing information

Measure

Know days of the week in order Know o'clock and half past times

Understand length, weight, capacity and area (more than covered less than covered)

Shape and Space

Know names and recognise 2D and 3D shapes square, rectangle, circle, triangle, hexagon, pentagon — cube, cuboid, cylinder, cone, sphere, pyramid. Understand positional words—forwards, backwards, up, down, beside, between...

Literacy

There are lots of reading, writing, spelling and grammar books and activities to get through in P3 and

this work will also need your on-going support.

Spelling

We start learning spellings from the beginning of the year.. These are taught in school using the 'look, cover, say, check' approach and are tested on a Friday.

Reading

In Year 3 we revisit the high frequency words covered in Year 2, then we focus on sounds from the linguistic phonics programme. Tricky words that do not follow the sound patterns need to be learnt using the 'look and say' approach.

Pupils need to read daily. We have silent reading time in school each day and guided reading activities with the class teacher. Please complete any reading activities homework sent home and actively encourage reading at bedtime.

Writing, punctuation and grammar

We will be concentrating on correct formation of lower and upper case letters and writing on lines independently. We focus on many aspects of literacy. including compound words, nouns, verbs, adjectives, alphabetical order. We will use . . ? in our writing.
