

Homework

Pupils will have reading homework Monday to Thursday evenings each week.

They will have one phonic sound focus to practise through their spellings.

There is written homework Monday - Wednesday night. Mental maths homework is on-going and will be directed by the teacher and written in the homework diary.

ICT

Your child will have access to iPads, cameras, computers and interactive whiteboards to support their learning throughout the year.

Topic work in Year 5

In school we study the World Around Us (WAU) in each year group. Pupils in Year 5 will develop their WAU scientific, geographical and historical knowledge in 5 topics areas during the year, namely: Australia, Right up my street, Stone Age, Water and The Egyptians. Please read and discuss aspects of these topic areas at every opportunity at home.

Pupils will also work on their **Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities (TSPC)** throughout their topic work including: Working with Others, Being Creative, Managing Information, Problem Solving/Decision making and Self-Management. Again please encourage opportunities for your child to develop these skills at home as well. Ask your teacher for ideas if needed.

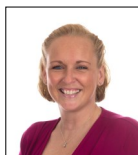

Numeracy

As you will hear, your child will have a lot of knowledge and skills to work through in Year 5. They will need your on-going support. The areas of Numeracy in Year 5 are:

Number

Recognising, ordering, sequencing and recording numbers to 10,000

Reciting times tables up to x 10

Demonstrate vertical addition with carrying and subtracting with exchange

Understand oral problem solving
Money—use money skills in the context of money up to £10

Understand and use simple fractions

Mentally add and subtract 2 digit numbers



Data Handling

Collect and record relevant data

Draw and label bar charts, Venn and Carroll diagrams
Read and interpret information from tables, data, charts and graphs.

Measure

Use appropriate units to measure and estimate length, volume, weight, time, area and temperature.
Read simple measuring instruments with a degree of accuracy

Read digital and analogue clock times, understand and interpret calendars.

Shape and Space

Recognise, name and describe the properties of 2D and 3D shapes

Use tessellation and grid references in practical context.
Recognise right angles and one line of symmetry.



Literacy

There are lots of reading, writing, spelling, grammar and comprehension activities to get through in Y5.

Spelling

Spellings are provided Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. These are revised on a Thursday and tested weekly. Spellings follow Linguistic phonics, key and topic words.

Reading

In Year 5 guided reading occurs each day through a literacy cycle. Guided reading groups are tailored to your child's reading ability. Depending on text, children should be reading one or two guided reading books a week. Children are provided with silent reading time each day to read a book of their choice independently. Classes have a weekly visit to the school library to broaden reading experiences.

Writing, punctuation and grammar

In Year 5 children are expected to use punctuation and grammar accurately and proficiently within all written activities. Handwriting should accurately formed and consistent in size. Writing is developed using a wide range of vocabulary, sequencing, structure and expressing opinions.
